KAH-NEE-TA was named after an Indian Woman, **XNITLA**, "ROOT DIGGER" who had owned the property where the resort now sits.

She was known to be a scout for some soldiers at one time. She was a Spiritual Healer using the natural Hot Springs for healing. And as her name Kah-nee-ta means "Root Digger" she was a gatherer of the natural vegetation of roots for food and medicine. Today these same roots are used for ceremonies and the main part of the native people's diet.

May 30, 1964 Kah-Nee-Ta village was completed with its mineral baths and olympic size swimming pool.

The Grand Opening of the Lodge and Convention Center took place on June 1, 1972.
