Warm Springs Agency Oregon Oct 13 1890
Dear Sweet-Mama

Your loving letter of the 9th came today
and relieved my some what anxious mind. I don't understand
about your not getting my letter of Oct 2. I think I wrote
two full sheets like this, and put in the one I rec'd from
Mr. Danderson & also a small silk handkerchief for
Clifford. I sent to Wapinitia for a silk one & they sent
me such a small one that I sent it to Clifford. I am
certain I sent it that time for Mr. Lesner was here &
I spoke about him. The letter was full more than
any letter I have ever sent and it may be someone
thought there were greenbacks in it. They got fooled
if they did. It may yet turn up. I guess I am going
to get fooled about going down by the 22. A letter from
Mr. W. Bude written last Friday says that Dr. D was
there, and intended to start for Warm Springs next
Monday or Tuesday, so he may be here this week.
The third time is the charm you know. Charley Pitt

I got my 30 scholars Saturday night and on to spare. To day there are 36.

and Peter & their families got home Saturday. Gene
died near Canyon Creek a week ago yesterday. They
buried her yesterday. No one went from the Agency
that I knew of. I dont even know where she was buried.
I helped launch to rather turn the new ferry boat -
in the river Saturday. It was built bottom up and
had to be turned with block & tackle fastened to a
tall post - about 60 ft high. The boat - turned all O.K.
and will likely be running in a week or ten days.
Dear one I wish I knew how you were. I cant but -
hope you will pass through safely. If I cant go now
I certainly will meet you in The Dalles, and if some
of the folks or some friend cant be with you that
far. I think I ought to go at least as far as Portland,
for its going to be a task too much of one to bethere
alone with two babes as you might say to take care of
as you will have if all goes well. If you had someone to
help you until you took the train for The Dalles it would
not be so bad. I will do as you think best. You need hardly
look for me now before or by the 22". I cant tell better
by the 20". We got the little clout nearly finished today.
I want to write Pa a few lines about the Anderson
letter, so will close for tonight. Oh I do hope you
