HB 1099
Prohibits filing for more than one public office without withdrawing first filing. Determination of dual filings, without proper withdrawal, prior to primary election makes all filings invalid.

SB 184
Permits declarations, petitions and other documents, that must be filed by 5 p.m. of last day for filing, to be received if person is physically in proper office awaiting his turn to deliver the documents.

HB 1096
Requires withdrawal of nomination of independent candidate or candidate for a minor party by 67th, instead of 69th, day before election.

_____, non-partisan office c.65
SB 140
Prohibits candidate for a non-partisan office defeated at primary from becoming candidate for same office at succeeding general election unless vacancy in nomination occurs prior to election.

Corrupt Practices, false statements, by candidates c.83
HB 1073
Prohibits candidate from publishing false statement about himself. Deletes minimum penalty.

_____, false statements, prior experience as legislator c.593
SB 554
Prohibits candidate for State Senator or State Representative from offering ballot or voters' pamphlet statement suggesting he has served in legislature unless he has. Requires Secretary of State to reject such statement if offered. Eff. 30 Jun. 67.

_____, political activities by public employees and corporate officers and employees c.630
HB 1663
Limits prohibition against political activities by regulated corporations to activity regarding candidates; deletes prohibition against activities by officers and employees; permits incidental activity on company time. Repeals prohibition against political activity by public employees, including employees of Oregon Liquor Control Commission; prohibits coercion of such employees or solicitation of such employees on the job.

HB 1101
Permits use of postal, office or temporary addresses on political material if candidate or a responsible officer of organization using such address first files his name and residence address with Secretary of State.

Districts, hours for voting; contested school election c.609
SB 171
Fixes 8 p.m. as closing hour for polls in district elections and 2 p.m. as opening hour unless otherwise provided by order calling election. Changes hours in certain districts. Provides procedure for review and setting aside a school election in which illegal votes are cast.

Initiative and referendum, broadcast as supplement to voters' pamphlet; public notices, broadcasts of c.63
SB 132
Authorizes radio and television broadcasts of public notices as supplement to publication thereof. Permits Secretary of State to cause broadcast of initiative and referendum information as supplement to voters' pamphlet. Specifies procedure and compensation for broadcast. Provides proof of broadcast form.

HB 1100
Requires filing officers to accept initiative and referendum petitions for filing without verification of signatures. Requires verification of signatures by county clerk and return to filing officer within 15 days after filing deadline.

Political parties, precinct committeemen, abolished districts c.124
SB 137
Provides that a committeeman shall continue as a member of county central committee until next regular election for precinct committeeman when his precinct is combined, consolidated or abolished.

HB 1408
Modifies provisions for determining vacancy in office of committeeman. Permits vacancy to be filled by a person from an adjoining precinct. Provides procedure for recall of committeeman. Fixes term of committeeman elected or appointed by central committee. Makes person who is a member of any other political party ineligible for office of committeeman.

SB 138
Deletes two provisions of law relating to political parties which conflict with similar provisions enacted in 1965.

HB 1075
Prohibits release of election results until polls are closed, as that time is fixed for the Pacific zone under the Uniform Time Act. Provides penalties.

Voter registration, cancellation time c.64
SB 136
Changes time for purge of register of electors to before instead of after elections. Provides new cancellation procedure.

_____, name change c.25
HB 1071
Eliminates re-registration at polling place when an individual votes on a "proof of name change". Requires re-registration under new name to be eligible to vote thereafter.

HB 1072
Directs Secretary of State to furnish, upon request of any candidate, his opponent's voters' pamphlet material. Prohibits use of material submitted by candidate for voters' pamphlet in proceeding to restrain or enjoin publication of such pamphlet.

HB 1472
Reduces from five years to one year term of voting machine rental agreements made between Secretary of State and county.

HB 1756

Modifies provisions related to multiple use of state-owned forest lands under jurisdiction of State Forestry Department; permits State Forester to accept surety bonds for bid deposit on state timber sales and facilitates

forest land exchanges under ORS chapter 530. Permits State Land Board and State Board of Forestry to return lands dedicated for forest purposes to original status where public interest is served.

Forest protection laws, revision

c.429
HB 1186

Revises forest protection laws, including those related to costs and liability of landowners and operators. Permits forester to promulgate rules for conduct of certain fire-hazardous activities during closed season. Deletes present statutory requirements for conduct of such activities. Modifies terminology of forest land classes. Sets new area boundaries from which members are appointed to State Board of Forestry.

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Insects and disease, eradication and control

c.87
HB 1150

Increases powers of State Forester in relation to eradication and control of forest insects and forest tree diseases. Provides for collection of costs incurred in performance of such work in same manner as forest patrol assessments.

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Privilege tax and fire patrol assessment, combination

c.179
SB 214

Permits combination, for certification to county assessor, of Class C forest land privilege tax and assessment for fire patrol, as to lands which pay both.

HB 1527

Prohibits performance by children under 18 at public dance unless alcoholic beverages are excluded, applicable laws are observed and at least one responsible adult is present to insure compliance with laws, or if child has written permission of juvenile court. Permits more strict regulations by local governments. Eliminates requirement that juvenile court must consent to participation by child under 16 in public entertainment, but continues supervision by Wage and Hour Commission. Eff. 23 Jun. 67. a

Minimum wage law c.596
HB 1340

Establishes minimum wage of \$1.25 per hour, applying to workmen employed in Oregon; gives Wage and Hour Commission rule-making power regarding certain classes of employes and exempts others. Provides penalties. a

SB 167

Requires persons employed under public contracts or by governmental units through a contractor to be paid overtime for work performed on Saturday and legal holidays specified in ORS 187.010 except Veterans Day. Permits overtime pay for Veterans Day and holidays specified in ORS 187.020 when specifically agreed to under labor-management negotiated agreement. Eff. 19 Apr. 67. a/lsp

HB 1577

Specifies number of times wage certifications must be filed on public contracts. Edc

HB 1450

Authorizes commissioner to deduct penalties as well as costs and attorney fees from wage claims collected by him. Provides that assigning wage claimant is not party to collection actions brought by commissioner. a

Apprenticeship and training c.6
HB 1105

Revises procedures for apprenticeship and training. Regulates agreements between employers and apprentices or trainees. Redesignates State Apprenticeship Council as State Apprenticeship and Training Council, and establishes new criteria for appointment of members. Authorizes Labor Commissioner to appoint Director of Apprenticeship and Training, with consent of council. Provides for local joint committees, trade apprenticeship and training committees and state joint committees. Eff. 20 Feb. 67. a

Children, employment c.347
HB 1528

Authorizes Wage and Hour Commission to permit employment of child under 18 in certain employments otherwise prohibited if child has vocational training and has graduated from high school or is to be employed during summer vacation. Requires commission to check suitability of such employment. Eff. 2 Jun. 67. a

Abandoned vehicles, impoundment and disposition

c.484
HB 1525

Provides 24-hour waiting period before impoundment of vehicle which State Police or sheriff believe to be abandoned or disabled. Shortens period within which owner must, after notice, claim impounded vehicle from 30 to 20 days; limitation on storage charges from 90 to 30 days; and period before vehicle may be sold from 90 to 30 days. Provides for disposition and issuance of certificate of sale, without public auction, of vehicle appraised at \$75 or less. Prohibits abandoning vehicles.

Provides procedures for withdrawal of territory from a district and for dissolution of a district. *etc*

Willamette River Park System

HB C.551
1770

Establishes Willamette River Park System. Permits State Highway Commission to pay 50% of cost to units of local government to acquire interests in land. Creates Willamette River Park System Committee. Limits commission expenditures to \$800,000. Eff. 30 Jun. 69. Repealed 30 Jun. 69. *n*

Conservation and scenic easements

HB C.318
1581

Authorizes state agencies, counties, cities and park and recreation districts to acquire conservation or scenic easements, except by eminent domain. Provides notice and hearing procedures. Requires reduction in assessment of property subject to such easements. *a*

Ocean beaches, public rights

HB C.601
1601

Declares legislative intent to preserve and maintain public rights existing or created in Pacific seashore for public use and benefit, and to acquire additional rights to protect scenic and recreational use of ocean beaches. Directs Highway Commission to protect and confirm such public rights and permits commission to acquire additional rights as appropriate in adjacent or contiguous lands. Prohibits erection of structures or improvements in certain areas of Pacific shore without permit from Highway Department. Sets forth procedures for application, notice and hearing for such permits. Directs department to police, protect and maintain lands subject to public easement by Act and to submit survey of such lands to Fifty-fifth Legislative Assembly. Provides that lands found subject to public easement be taken into consideration when assessing real property for tax purposes after January 1, 1968. Eff. 6 Jul. 67. *a*

Community work and training program c.130 HB 1291

Redesignates "work relief program" as "community work and training program". Details status of participants with respect to civil service, retirement, unemployment compensation and workmen's compensation.

Counties, welfare budgets, reduction c.240 SB 343

Authorizes State Welfare Commission to reduce county welfare budget within fiscal year under certain circumstances.

Medical assistance program c.502 HB 1769

Establishes medical assistance program for categorically needy and medically needy persons. Fixes minimum income and resource levels for eligibility of medically needy. Authorizes Public Welfare Commission to use medical assistance funds to provide required services through insurance or contracts with health, medical and hospital contractors. Establishes medical advisory committee of 15 members appointed by Governor. Directs that medical assistance be provided categorically needy and permits assistance to medically needy beginning July 1, 1967, provided funds are available. Eff. 1 Jul. 67.

Patients in state institutions, costs of care c.549 HB 1746

Directs Board of Control, in establishing reimbursement rates for care of persons in state institutions, to insure that such rates reflect current costs directly related to care of such persons. Revises procedure for determining ability of a person to pay for care of relative or other person in a state institution. Eff. 30 Jun. 67.

Public assistance, blind date of payment c.285 HB 1287

Deletes requirement that aid to the blind shall begin on first day of the month in which assistance is given.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

SB 198

Permits waiver, in hardship cases, of unemployment benefit disqualification of individuals who leave work on account of marital status or domestic duties. Provides that pregnancy must be reason for leaving work in order to disqualify pregnant individual.

Employer tax rates

c.434
SB 129

Modifies method of computing employer tax rates. Provides formula. Eff. 1 Jul. 67.

Independent contractors,
coverage

c.303
SB 176

Deletes requirement of being in an independently established business in order to be an independent contractor under unemployment insurance laws. Provides a method of determining amount of contributions for which an employer is liable if an individual is found to be his employe rather than an independent contractor.

Collective bargaining representatives, selection c.543

Directs boards and commissions administering civil service systems for public employes to establish procedures for selection of collective bargaining representatives of classified employes. Authorizes court process to enforce rules. Adds to ORS chapter 243. (H 1688)

District attorneys, deputies, salaries, private practice c.633

Fixes annual salaries of district attorneys on basis of population of counties, instead of for counties by name. Prohibits private practice of law by district attorneys and deputies receiving annual salaries over \$10,000. Repeals ORS 8.725, 8.795, 8.800. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1659)

Insurance, county officers and employes c.432

Authorizes insurance covering county officers and employes for annuities and other retirement benefits, and expands existing authorized medical insurance coverage. Limits insurers to Oregon licensees. Amends ORS 203.122. Eff. 19 May 65. (H 1763)

Retirement, Multnomah County elective officers c.605

Establishes retirement system for Multnomah County elective officers, integrated with existing retirement system for county employes. Specifies service and age eligibility for retirement benefits, computation of benefits, contributions and election not to participate. Adds to ORS 238.010 to 238.100. Eff. 1 Jan 66. (H 1606)

_____, Multnomah County employes c.607

Changes retirement system for Multnomah County employes to authorize rules and regulations by retirement board, prohibit participation by employes first employed after age 50, permit withdrawal by employes who will not become eligible for benefits, specify benefits for certain employes with 14 years service and their reemployment for federal social security purposes, redescribe use of retirement fund, revise county and employe contributions, redefine employe eligibility and prescribe new computation of benefits. Amends and repeals sections in and adds to ORS 238.010 to 238.100. Eff. 1 Jan 66. (H 1769)

_____, public employes, investments c.497

Requires State Treasurer to follow instructions of Public Employes' Retirement Board as to sale or exchange of securities representing investments of Public Employes' Retirement Fund. Amends ORS 237.274. (S 196)

_____, public employes, prior service credit c.533

Authorizes payment, under Public Employes' Retirement System, of prior service pension based on service by employes who retired after 1947, instead of after 1960, rendered before employer commenced to participate in system and for which employe did not receive credit because his service was interrupted for more than five years. Amends ORS 237.085. (H 1386)

Salaries, Multnomah County c.251

Requires Multnomah County officers and employes to be paid bi-weekly. Adds to ORS chapter 204. Amends ORS 204.245, 204.255, 210.160. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1396)

State officers and employes, civil service; public employes; salaries c.405

Places state department and division heads appointed with approval of Governor in unclassified service. Declares Economic Opportunity Act trainees not covered by civil service, public retirement or unemployment insurance, but may be under workmen's compensation. Fixes salary of elected Superintendent of Public Instruction. Amends ORS 240.205. Repeals ORS 292.737. Eff. 19 May 65. (H 1016)

_____, payroll deductions c.23

Authorizes payroll officer, upon employe's written request, to deduct from payroll premiums for life, medical and indemnity group insurance, one of each type per employe. Requires payment of amounts deducted to insurance company and others. Validates prior deductions. Repeals ORS 292.050, 292.060. Eff. 26 Feb 65. (H 1046)

_____, salaries c.14

Changes statutory minimum and maximum salaries of certain state officers and employes. Permits limited additional increases during 1965-67 biennium. Provides for fixing of salaries of State Police in same manner as employes in unclassified service; eff. 24 Feb 65. Amends and repeals sections in ORS chapters 181, 273, 292, 437, 491. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1007)

_____, Suggestion Awards Board, membership, awards c.9

Increases membership of Suggestion Awards Board to five by adding two state officers appointed by Governor. Removes statutory limit on continuous appropriation for awards. Amends ORS 182.320. Repeals 182.340. (H 1045)

_____, travel allowance c.8

Increases to eight cents per mile allowance for use by state officers and employes of privately-owned motor vehicle on official or state-related business. Amends ORS 292.250 and 292.260. (H 1018)

benefits equal to .97% of final average salary times years of membership up to 25 years for police officers and firemen and .67% of final average salary times years of service up to 30 years for other members. Requires that disability benefit of member disabled before retirement age shall, when combined with any earned income of such member, not be less than \$400 per month. Requires personnel continued beyond retirement age to continue their contributions to fund. Increases earliest retirement age for teachers from 50 to 60.

Establishes Variable Annuity Account and permits members to elect to put up to 50% of their future contributions, and up to 50% of their current account balance into this account, to be invested as prescribed in Act.

Increases reserves for pension accounts and annuities established after January 1, 1968, to 3 1/4%. Limits present dividend from excess interest to retired employe members to those retiring before 1968. Permits amortization over not less than 30 years of liabilities accruing to system on account of pensions provided by employer contributions. Requires employers to match lump sum deposits and interest made by employe under ORS 237.065. Part eff. 1 Jan. 69; part eff. 1 Jan. 68.

Modifies benefits and contributions under Teachers' Retirement System (applicable to Portland School District No.1), generally to coincide with modification of benefits and contributions under PERS by chapter 622 (1967). Eff. 1 Jan. 68.

Extends public employes retirement credits to veterans who served in Armed Forces subsequent to June 25, 1950.
