Memorial Pendleton Woolen Mills blankets were presented to the many guests who attended.

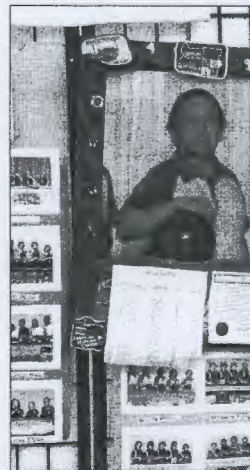
