AND A SOLID RECORD OF ACCOMPLISHMENT FOR THE PEOPLE OF WASHINGTON COUNTY

▶ DAIRY INDUSTRY

As Chairman of the House Food and Dairy Committee in 1963, Victor Atiyeh helped develop legislation guaranteeing a minimum price to milk producers, averting for some time federal control of this industry.

▶ ENVIRONMENT

As a member of the Interim Committee on Public Health and 1969 Chairman of the special Senate Committee on Air and Water Control, Senator Atiyeh played a leading role in developing the strongest laws on air and water pollution in the State's history.

▶ TAX ECONOMY

Senator Atiyeh was a leader in eliminating Inventory Tax in Oregon — the results were increased payrolls and fewer people on unemployment and welfare.

▶ MENTAL HEALTH

Senator Atiyeh fought for legislation to give aid to the trainable mentally retarded.

▶ EDUCATION

Victor Atiyeh was the chief sponsor of the Teacher Standard Practice Act and was named Washington County's "Citizen of the Year" in 1965 by the Oregon Education Association. He is now the Chairman of the important Education Committee of the State Senate.
