

Still some hope was entertain-  
ed of his relief or partial recovery,  
till the last ten or twelve days,  
since, which time recovery has  
not been expected. His suffering  
during a portion of the time was  
very great especially during the  
last two or three weeks of his  
sickness but he endured all  
with great fortitude & with <sup>much</sup> pa-  
tience, though his nervous pow-  
er was greatly broken. He was  
sustained by an unflinching <sup>trust</sup>  
in the ~~sure~~ mercy of God in  
Christ, indicated by his repeat-  
ing the passage I know that

my Redeemer liveth". The  
presence & tender care & sym-  
pathy of several of his children  
besides those living with him,  
greatly cheered & sustained him  
in these last few trying days;  
& finally the severity of his suf-  
fering somewhat relaxed & he  
died quietly & peacefully Wednes-  
day P.M. about three o'clock, &  
triumphantly in the faith.  
aged seventy one years & six  
months & some days.

1 Mr Scott, was a tender  
& devoted Father, though  
rigidly exacting obedience

& an affectionate & careful  
husband.

2. He was public spirited  
& patriotic, & a lover of  
liberty & the right, always  
& consistently opposing op-  
pression & disunion.

3 He was decided in his  
moral & religious views.  
upholding temperance &  
good morals generally &  
& evangelical in his re-  
ligious views, always up-  
rightly & conscientiously  
upholding good morals  
& religion in principle

to practice according to  
the knowledge & light  
which he had.
