Warm Springs Agency Oregon Oct 17 1890
Ever Dear Mamma

I was again made happy in hearing from you. It is strange about your letters I send. I write regularly every mail, and they should reach you regularly. I wish you would notice some of the letters and see if they are tampered with. They tell me that Van Duzyn at Pygh has been known to open letters. Well Dr & wife have come at last. Arrived at about 11.30 Today They spent two nights at Sineuasho. They visited the school this P.M. I invited them down to a sing tonight. Sallie Pitt happened to be here so I asked her to stay over night with us. I like Mr & Mrs D so far as I have been with them. They put off till tomorrow before they go through the buildings. They were too tired today. Up stairs is in good shape and down is scrub day down stairs so that will be improved some though it is good enough now. Mrs Blair is very neat, and takes lots of pains in getting up good meals for the children.

I am writing this just after supper, as I may not have much
time later on. Mr Sampson went to The Dalles nearly a
week ago, as Lizzie was pretty sick with Typhoid fever I
understood. I think Dr D intends going back Monday.
He has consented to talk to the Indians next Sabbath
The enclosed letter will inform you that a Missionary is
coming, so I may carry the word along as I have until he
comes. I have given up going for the present, unless I
get word, or see a better chance than I now do to get away.
I am quite unconcerned as to what Dr D may think of
the situation. I hardly think he will find sufficient
(if any) cause to make a change, as far as we are con-
cerned. If he is anxious to find a cause of course one can
be hatched up, but if there is, there'll be a lively time some
time. I have done my duty as well as I know how, and there I
leave it. Mrs Starr and Gettie came home today, for good
I presume. They have 27 scholars at Lemnawash. I wanted 40
here before tomorrow night but fear I'll not get them. Your
Leslies came today but I guess I'll keep it until you return.
Dr S is going Monday I believe. I wish I could go too.
