Lynn Hardy - crews visit Powder river slide. Conclusions: damage up-stream virtually nil -- water back up 1 mile; possibly jeopardize 1 home. Damage down-stream not too bad. Flooding would jeopardize some homes but mostly old, abandoned buildings.

Blockage has necessitated a torturous 20 mile detour -- severe inconvenience to residents of Richland. ODOT believes \$150,000 to keep detour open during winter. Corps of Engineers looking at for utilization of their emergency fund. Doesn't believe the cost/benefit analysis will be there

Archie Mustard in The Dalles discussing routine emergency plans with local coordinator. Archie went to local Rotary to discuss generic plan. Question raised about Rajneesh -- said nothing to do with Rajneesh. Rumor then started that all had to do with defense against Rajneesh.

Dean Smith - Victor Coleman who has long record involved with blue algae in K Falls applied for license. Advised Dean to keep Pat apprised for sake of Land Board.

John Williams - reviewed briefly problems at Rajneesh.

Marijuana patch discovered on BLM land 3 miles north of California border. Hunters discovered and began to harvest. Were discovered by growers. Extreme violence occurred, too gruesome to write. No deaths. Some shooting, some beating and other gruesome acts. One apprehended; still looking for other.

General Miller - 41st infantry brigade was told would get new designation without mission in mind. New appropriations bill instructs Army to correct and report new mission.

Will be going to New York for 106th annual meeting of National Guard. Operation Serenity report finished and ready as back up to State Police.
