FAITH... Founded by Congregational ministers and laymen Pacific University has been closely connected with the Congregational churches since 1849. It is now officially connected with the denomination through the Division of Higher Education of the Board of Home Missions.

FREEDOM... Students of all races, nationalities and creeds are welcomed. . . A scholarly faculty, free to present truth as they believe it. . . A large measure of student participation in determining the nature of all religious, cultural and social activities.

FELLOWSHIP... Classes are small. . . An intimate campus and a friendly faculty means there are no "forgotten students." The limited size of the student body makes for greater opportunity for self-expression and development of the individual.

R-R-R... An accredited liberal arts college. Pacific believes that a broad basic education in the arts and sciences is a prime necessity before vocational specialization. A full range of courses in religion and religious education gives to every student the opportunity of strengthening his (or her) faith. In addition to preparation for graduate study for the Christian ministry and other church vocations, Pacific offers programs of teacher training for elementary and secondary school teachers, and prepares for vocations in journalism, business and optometry. For those planning further study there are majors in language, English, political science, economics, sociology, history, chemistry, geology, psychology, physics, and others.

SCHOLARSHIPS

For the student who needs financial assistance in completing college, Pacific University is able to provide help in the form of scholarships, grants-in-aid or campus employment.
