

FLOOR STATEMENT OF THE HON. LES AUCOIN

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 13, 1982

MR. SPEAKER. I KNOW THAT THERE IS SOME FEAR THAT THE LEGISLATION BEFORE US WILL GENERATE INCREASES IN TRANSPORTATION COSTS, AND THAT THOSE INCREASES WILL FALL EVENTUALLY ON THE ULTIMATE CONSUMER. I CAN FIND NOTHING IN THIS LEGISLATION WHICH WOULD SUPPORT THAT CONTENTION OR GIVE RISE TO THAT FEAR. EVERYTHING IN THIS BILL, FROM THE REQUIREMENT THAT CONFERENCE MEMBERSHIP NOT BE RESTRICTED TO THE REQUIREMENTS FOR INDEPENDENT ACTION AND NONDISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES EFFECTIVELY POLICED BY A FEDERAL REGULATORY BODY DEMONSTRATES THAT WE HAVE TAKEN AN ARCHAIC, SIXTY SIX-YEAR OLD, PIECE OF LEGISLATION WHICH PRODUCED HIGH TRANSPORTATION COSTS AND MODERNIZED IT SO THAT THESE SHIPPING COMPANIES CAN FULLY UTILIZE TECHNICAL AND COMMERCIAL INNOVATION SO AS TO REDUCE THE COSTS OF TRANSPORTATION.

H.R. 4374 WILL, I AM CONFIDENT, PRODUCE THESE KINDS OF EFFICIENCIES AND REVERSE THE CURRENT SITUATION WHERE THE COSTS OF TRANSPORTING GOODS FROM THE UNITED STATES ARE FREQUENTLY AS MUCH AS THREE HUNDRED PERCENT HIGHER THAN THE FREIGHT PAID BY OUR COMPETITORS WHEN WE DEAL WITH SIMILAR THIRD MARKETS. THE OVERWHELMING ENDORSEMENT OF THIS BILL BY PRACTICALLY EVERY IMPORTER AND EXPORTER WHO USES OCEAN TRANSPORTATION SERVICES IS LOUD TESTIMONY THAT H.R. 4374 WILL GENERATE RELIABLE SERVICES AT

REASONABLE RATES. THE BUSINESSMEN WHO MAKE UP THE EXPORT/IMPORT INDUSTRY KNOW THAT THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN MAKING A SALE AND NOT IS THE COST OF THE TRANSPORTATION COMPONENT OF THE LANDING COST OF A PRODUCT OR COMMODITY. ONLY IF LEGISLATION IS PERCEIVED AS ENSURING COMPETITIVE RATES FOR REASONABLE SERVICE WILL THIS GROUP OF BUSINESSMEN ENDORSE A BILL SUCH AS THIS. THE CONSUMER CANNOT POSSIBLY BE VICTIMIZED BY THIS BILL.

I AM MOST ENCOURAGED THAT THE COMMITTEES ON MERCHANT MARINE AND JUDICIARY HAVE ACHIEVED THE KIND OF COMPROMISE WHICH IS REFLECTED IN THE BILL BEFORE US. I INTEND TO VOTE FOR THIS BILL, AND I URGE MY COLLEAGUES TO JOIN ME IN ACTIVE SUPPORT OF H.R. 4374.
