(Condensed) Second annual fair held by the Newberg Agricultural Society. New 40' X 80' pavilion erected on South Meridian Street for this three-day gala, Oct. 2 - 4.

"There were twelve Indian children from the Indian training school at Forest Grove, Oregon, here with considerable of their work, in the shape of bread, some fancy and needle work, boots and shoes, blacksmithing, etc., all of which was looked upon with a great deal of interest and astonishment with many, to think that an Indian can, in so short a time be educated and learn to execute work equal to the white man."
