

Frosh Males To Scrub Seal

Freshman, under Vic Atiyeh and Order of the "O" men, are to meet at 1 p.m. Friday in front of Villard to wash the Oregon seal according to announcement Wednesday by Jim Rathbun, "O" president.

Immediately after polishing the brasswork the freshmen will go in a body to Skinner's butte to paint the Oregon "O" and post guards who will remain on duty until Sunday morning.

The "O" will be kept inviolate by freshmen working in shifts, according to organizations. Any weapons except firearms are permissible, and plans to mine the surrounding area are entirely false, a source near the riot squad chairman said late yesterday.

Frosh Daub At Alum Fete

As an innovation during Homecoming weekend, freshmen will skid down the yellow "O" atop Skinner's butte on their paint-splashed tin pants to precede the annual frosh guarding of the school landmark, Russ Hudson, Homecoming general chairman, announced Monday. Ordinarily this is done only during Junior Weekend, but it will be done this year, Hudson declared, to give visiting alums a more striking picture of the "O."

In charge of freshmen guarding the "O" will be Vic Atiyeh, guard on the frosh football team, Hudson said. He will work with the Homecoming committee and the freshman class, led by Ted Yaw. The "O" will be painted a bright yellow Friday, November 28, and will be guarded continuously until the alumni fete is over.

Guarding will be done in shifts, with at least 15 freshmen present at one time to prevent mutilation by other parties. Last year the guard was circumvented and the "O" streaked over.

The contest has covered a period of three weeks during which two representatives from each women's living organization on the campus have been invited to a series of desserts. Finalists were chosen October 27.

Art Wiggin, social chairman, was in charge of the contest.
