A RECORD OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY

A LEADER IN STOPPING FEDERAL CONTROL OF DAIRY INDUSTRY

As Chairman of the House Food and Dairy Committee, Victor Atiyeh helped develop legislation guaranteeing a minimum price to milk producers, thereby averting federal control of this industry.

DEVELOPED LAWS TO COMBAT AIR AND WATER POLLUTION

As a member of the Interim Committee on Public Health and special Senate Committee on Air and Water Control, Senator Atiyeh played a leading role in developing the strongest laws on air and water pollution in the State's history.

A LEADER IN ELIMINATING INVENTORY TAX

The results were increased payrolls and reduced unemployment and welfare payments.

ADEQUATE PROGRAM FOR THE MENTALLY RETARDED

Senator Atiyeh fought for legislation to give aid to the trainable mentally retarded and is now a member of the State Mental Health Review Committee. This advisory board, composed of Doctors, laymen and two members of the Legislature, review requests for grants in the field of mental health.

HELPED UP-GRADE TEACHING PROFESSION

Victor Atiyeh was the chief sponsor of the Teacher Standard Practice Act. For his work, the Oregon Education Association named him Washington County's "Citizen Of The Year" in 1965.
