EXTRACT FROM REGULATIONS NAVAL ACADEMY.

“Whenever a Student of the Fourth Class shall have three hundred (300) demerits; of the Third Class, two hundred and fifty (250); of the Second Class, two hundred (200); and of the First Class, one hundred and fifty (150); recorded against him during the Academic Year, his case shall be brought up before the Academic Board for examination, and if, in their opinion, the demerits have been given for persistent violation of the regulations, or disgraceful conduct, or show an immoral tendency not to be cured, the Student will be reported to the Secretary of the Navy, with such recommendations as the Board may deem proper to make.”

Midshipmen will not be permitted to receive, from any source, money, in addition to their pay.

Any remittances for their use from their parents, guardians, or other friends must be made to the “Paymaster of the Naval Academy,” who will receipt for and credit them, and disburse them under the general regulations of the Institution.

Class Reports are made during the Academic Year only, which is from the 1st of October to the conclusion of the June examination.

It is considered specially necessary that nothing whatever should occur to interfere, in the slightest degree, with the instruction and drills of the Academy, and the Superintendent is not authorized to give leave of absence to any Midshipman without the direct sanction of the Navy Department.

All express charges and telegrams to Midshipmen, from their parents or friends, must be prepaid.
