SUBJECT: Daily Report

The issue with which you were confronted during media time regarding new ADC rules was quickly referred to Keith Putman. Attached is his new policy and the change in the rules which resolve that problem, specifically item 3.

Jack Caldwell called from the Port of Portland indicating the prevalent rumor amongst his staff. They are hearing there will be a possible attempt to block Bill Fast's appointment. No one faction has been identified. It appears to be coming from both business and labor. I made Shirley aware of this.

Hearing continued rumbles that the Republicans are concerned that they were not consulted prior to your decision for a special session.

A lot of concern is being expressed as to how much trust can be placed on the Senate side for being a single issue special session. You should be aware that there is discussion of two or three alternative approaches on the court reform bill that may come from the Democrat side, none yet identified.

Forgot to tell you Bob Voy cancelled the LCAC meeting because you were unable to attend and he will reschedule.

Gene Maudlin called. PGE met today. At this point they are refusing to contribute to the \$17.5 WPPSS mothball fund. Puget Sound may do about the same thing. These are not final decisions. WPPSS still working with PGE, but it looks like getting the mothballing put together is becoming more and more doubtful. Pat has been notified.
