

SUMMARY: Jernstedt vehicle was eastbound on I-84N when the deceased stepped right out in front of the car. The deceased was accompanied by her boy friend. They had drunk beer in the Parkrose area and then had stopped along the highway at the scene, apparently to relieve themselves, when the deceased, for an unknown reason, attempted to cross the highway.

Blood was taken from both the deceased and Senator Jernstedt; results are pending. Lt. Thacker of the Multnomah County Sheriff's office stated that there is no reason to suspicion the Senator's physical condition. Multnomah County Case #81-23109.
