

Warm Springs Or Aug 21 1890

Dear Mary

I had a very sick turn  
yesterday, when no letter came from you.  
I came the nearest "booming" I have since  
you left me. I thought sure a letter mailed on  
Monday morning would reach me Wednesday.  
If a letter written Sunday were mailed Sunday night  
for the 8 o'clock train I would be quite sure of it -  
Wednesday. Now I must wait until Friday P.M.  
Last night was the coolest we have had since I  
came home. Had a sea breeze all day. It is clear  
and cloudless this morning. I finished making out  
one copy yesterday of the Indian Census. I am commenced  
on the duplicate. We have just mailed the Quarterly  
Returns. Mr Davis just told me he saw Herman at  
Dufur. He asked Herman when he was going back to  
the Agency. He said he was going to stay the 30 days

if I did not send for him. Davis said that I might want  
Laura the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month. I told him we could get along a  
few days. Mr Luskay got a letter from Fillard Holman  
at Penneville, enclosing one from Senator Dolph, to whom  
he sent his application. Dolph says that he was not aware  
that there was a vacancy in the Agency school. That he  
thought the selection of teachers was left with the agent -  
but he would consult with the rest of the delegation,  
from Oregon. At the bottom of the letter he wrote that he  
and Mitchell had recommended him favorably.

Now he wants Luskay to recommend him. Luskay  
is not going to do so. Will write him that there is no vacancy  
and no reason for sending on his name. Luskay thinks he  
don't want him anyway from what he can learn. Gov  
Penneyer & Sec Mc Bride signed his paper just to get rid  
of him. so Mrs Todd says. She was there when he came  
to the Governor, and heard them laughing about it. Mc Bride's  
wife and Holman's are sisters I believe, but they don't like him.  
I got a letter from Dr Dougherty yesterday, who sends his regards.  
It was mostly about his business. We are looking for Simpson  
home today, coming out horse back, from The Dalles. Don't know  
whether he is going to accept the Linemarker school or not.  
Well breakfast is called, so I will close hoping hopefully  
forward for tomorrow's mail. Many I do love you and little Clifford
