#### DEFINITION OF ENERGY FACILITY:

Energy facilities subject to the Council's jurisdiction are generally large facilities which produce or transmit energy for a utility system as opposed to equipment which saves or produces energy for individual consumers such as residential solar or small wind devices. Specifically, the following types of facilities are included in the term "energy facility" which defines the Siting Council's jurisdication:

- 1. All electric generating stations including a nuclear power or fossil fuel plants of over 25 megawatts (MW). However, for certain energy recovery energy facilities only, the Siting Council's jurisdiction does not begin until the production of at least 50 MW. These energy recovery facilities are facilities which are designed to be fueled by wood, municipal wastes or solid wastes.
- 2. Any nuclear installation such as nuclear fuel processing plants.
- 3. All high voltage transmission lines which exceed ten miles in length with a capacity in excess of 230 kilovolts (KV) and which cross more than one county.
- 4. Large solar energy facilities which use more than 100 acres of land or provide more than 25 MW of power.
- 5. Pipelines for the transportation of crude petroleum, liquified natural gas, other fossil energy including natural gas and synthetic gas or geothermal energy using pipelines for five or more miles in length.
- 6. A synthetic fuel plant or any size which converts resources such as coal, oil, or biomass to a gas liquid or solid product for energy.

The Siting Council also regulates transportation of radioactive waste in Oregon, underground storage of natural gas, certain low level radioactive waste storage and uranium mills.

IV.

subject: Agency Head Reappointments

Beginning next month and running through the remainder of 1983, many directors will have served Governor Atiyeh for four years. The issue of reappointment has arisen because Article XV, Section 2 provides:

"When the duration of any office is not provided for by this Constitution, it may be declared by law; and if not so declared, such office shall be held during the pleasure of the authority making the appointment. But the Legislative Assembly shall not create any office, the tenure of which shall be longer than four years."

These agency heads hold "offices" falling within this Constitutional provision.

As indicated in the attached list of individual appointments, most of these officers serve at the pleasure of the Governor rather than for specific terms. Because they serve for indefinite terms and at the pleasure of the Governor, the four-year limitation does not apply and reappointment is not necessary. 39 Opinions Attorney General 649, 651-652 (1979).

However, reappointment was intended by the Legislature for those seven agency heads with statutory four-year terms. In effect these agency heads are appointed on the same basis as a citizen appointed to a board or commission for a set term.

Nevertheless, the Governor has authority to defer appointment or reappointment to an office. If so, the result would be the same as if the person served without term and at the pleasure of the Governor. This is because Article XV, Section 1 of the Oregon Constitution provides that all officers shall remain in office until successors are both appointed and qualified. Although this constitutional provision was intended to allow an officer to temporarily hold over for a brief period, the Oregon Supreme Court has construed it as allowing the incumbent to hold over without limit in time. 39 Opinions Attorney General 619, 622-623 (1979).

#### SALARIES AND EXPENSES OF NONELECTIVE STATE OFFICIALS

292.495 Compensation and expenses of members of state boards and commissions. (1) Subject to the availability of funds therefor in the budget of the state board or commission, and except as otherwise provided by law, any member of a state board or commission, other than a member who is employed in full-time public service, who is authorized by law to receive compensation for time spent in performance of official duties, shall receive a payment of \$30 for each day or portion thereof during which the member is actually engaged in the performance of official duties.

- (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, all members of state boards and commissions, including those employed in full-time public service, may receive actual and necessary travel or other expenses actually incurred in the performance of their official duties within the limits provided by law or by the Executive Department under ORS 292.210 to 292.250.
- (3) As used in subsection (2) of this section, "other expenses" includes expenses incurred by a member of a state board or commission in employing a substitute to perform duties, including personal, normally performed by the member which the member is unable to perform because of the performance of official duties and which by the nature of such duties cannot be delayed without risk to health or safety.
