HISTORY

ARTIFACT: Indian Suitcase, in the Warm Springs language called a SAP'TA'KAI  
The SAP'TA'KAI is made out of raw deer hide and the dye made from red clay  
and berries. They are used to carry clothes and store items in.

This particular SAP'TA'KAI was originally owned by Blanch Tohet who stored  
Alec's (her husband) chief buckskin outfit in.

It was purchased from Elfreida Mitchell who is a Warm Springs tribal member  
and granddaughter to the Tohet's.

The WARM SPRINGS CONFEDERATED TRIBES would like to share this artifact with  
you and wish you a safe journey GOVERNOR ATIYEH.
