THE MOIST AND WARM SOUTHWESTERLY FLOW WILL CONTINUE ACROSS THE STATE TODAY ALTHOUGH IT APPEARS THAT THE HEAVY RAIN HAS SHIFTED NORTH INTO WASHINGTON STATE. HOWEVER.. ANOTHER FRONTAL SYSTEM WILL MOVE INTO THE STATE TODAY WITH SOME AREAS IN WESTERN SECTIONS STILL LIKELY TO GET MODERATE RAIN AT TIMES.

THE VERY HEAVY RAINFALL OF THE PAST COUPLE OF DAYS HAS CREATED A VERY SERIOUS FLOODING PROBLEM OVER COASTAL AND WILLAMETTE TRIBUTARY SYSTEMS AND FLOOD WARNINGS REMAIN IN EFFECT.

FORTY EIGHT HOUR RAINFALL AMOUNTS ENDING AT 4PM XMAS DAY SHOW THAT THE COLUMBIA GORGE NORTH CASCADES WILLAMETTE VALLEY AND CENTRAL AND SOUTH COAST CAUGHT THE BRUNT OF THE STORMS THE PAST TWO DAYS.

THE NORMALLY DRY DALLES ACCUMULATED 1.56 INCHES OF RAIN THE PAST 48 HRS. PORTLAND AND THE WILLAMETTE VALLEY REPORTED A LITTLE OVER 3 INCHES AND EUGENE 3.77 INCHES. THE CENTRAL AND SOUTH COAST REPORTED OVER 4 INCHES RAIN AT SOME LOCATIONS. THE SOUTH WEST INTERIOR REPORTED NEAR ONE HALF INCH. EAST OF THE CASCADES AMOUNTS WERE SIGNIFICANTLY LESS WITH MOST READINGS .15 INCHES OR LESS FOR THE 48 HR PERIOD ENDING AT 4PM XMAS DAY.

TEMPERATURE WERE WELL ABOVE NORMAL XMAS DAY WITH MOST READINGS BETWEEN 55 AND 65. NORMALS FOR THIS TIME OF YEAR RUN BETWEEN 45 AND 50 WEST OF THE CASCADES 35 TO 40 EAST SIDE. PORTLAND EXCEEDED ITS PREVIOUS RECORD WITH A HIGH OF 64. PREVIOUS RECORD WAS 59 IN 1972.

SATELLITE PHOTOS SHOW ANOTHER PACIFIC STORM HEADING TOWARD THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST..AND WILL LIKELY BE INCREASING RAINFALL INTENSITIES AGAIN TONIGHT. IT S POSSIBLE THE NEXT SYSTEM WILL HEAD A LITTLE FARTHER NORTH..WITH HEAVIEST RAIN MOSTLY NORTH OF OREGON.
